



1 THE MAISON D'IRÈNE WINE PRESS

This amazing monumental 18th century wine press is the sole surviving press using a wooden wheel and screw in this part of the Loire Valley near Orléans.

2 BOLLÉE BELL MUSEUM

This foundry-museum brings bells - church, cathedral and abbey bells from around the world - to life and lifts their voices in the purest tradition, showing how they are manufactured.

3 MUSÉE DE LA TONNELLERIE Cooperage Museum

Without coopers, how would we store our wine, cider or even cognac? Find out all about these craftspeople and their savoir-faire at this one-of-a-kind museum.

This renovated farm building features a selection of tools, testaments to 19th and 20th century farm work and objects of daily rural life. A garden of fruit trees rounds out the visit.

3 HÔTEL CABU MUSEUM OF HISTORY AND ARCHAEOLOGY

One of the city's most beautiful Renaissance monuments. Come discover its exceptional collection of Gallic and Gallo-Roman bronzes, and objects relating to the city's past and navigation on the Loire. The museum also holds temporary exhibitions on Joan of Arc and the History of Orléans.

4 FRAC CENTRE VAL DE LOIRE REGION

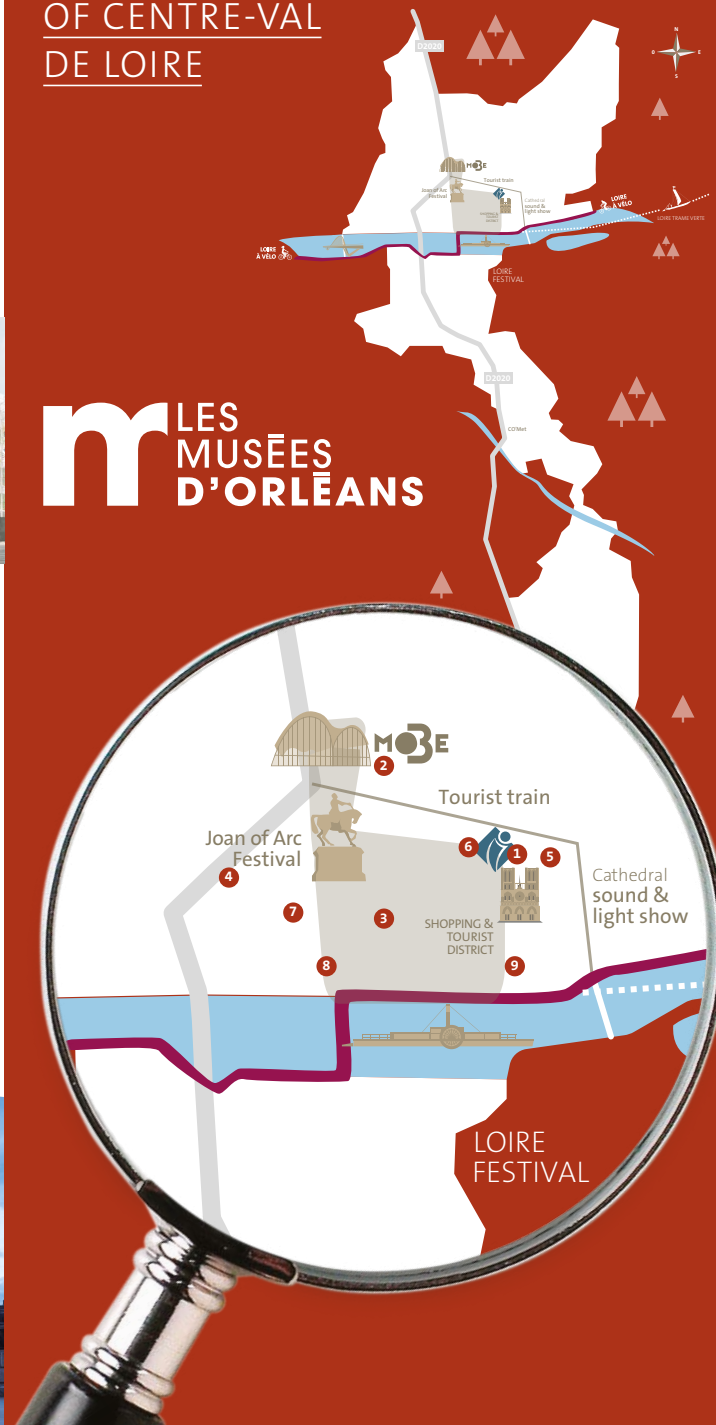
A venue designed to open eyes and hearts, bridging the gap between art, architecture and design by offering visitors a new artistic experience at the heart of innovative architecture.

5 CERCIL-MUSÉE

A memorial to Jewish children, victims of the Vel d'Hiv roundup in Paris. It offers an exhibit area with educational activities, cultural events and an archive centre for further research.

6 HÔTEL GROSLLOT

This typical Neo-Renaissance mansion opens the doors of its Salon d'Honneur and Wedding Room. Immerse yourself in a sumptuous setting which once hosted royal guests such as Charles IX and Henri IV!

7 JOAN OF ARC'S HOUSE

A half-timbered house, rebuilt on the site where Joan of Arc was lodged from April 29 to May 9, 1429 during the siege of Orléans.

A digital presentation tells about the life of Joan of Arc before you continue in her footsteps to the Hôtel Cabu and the Musée des Beaux-Arts. The research centre houses some 37,000 documents consecrated to her life and times!

8 CHARLES PEGUY CENTRE

From Tuesday to Saturday, come turn the pages of the life and works of the great Orléans writer and pamphleteer Charles Péguy in a new, fully renovated museum.

9 SAINT-PIERRE-LE-PUELLIER CLOISTER

One of the oldest churches in Orléans! This heritage site, dating back to the 12th century, now hosts a dozen temporary exhibitions each year.
