This amazing monumental 18th century wine press is the sole surviving press using a wooden wheel and screw in this part of the Loire Valley near Orleans.

MUSÉE DES BEAUX-ARTS

One of the largest collections of European paintings in France (Corrège, Velazquez, Van Dyck, Lenain, Boucher, Fragonard, Vigée-Lebrun, Guérin, Cogniet, Delacroix, Gauguin, Hantai, Zao-Wou-Ki, Debré...), an exceptional gallery of pastels and varied cultural agenda (conferences, workshops, concerts, theatre, etc.).

2 MOBE

3 HÔTEL CABU MUSEUM OF HISTORY AND ARCHAFOLOGY

One of the city's most beautiful Renaissance monuments. Come discover its exceptional collection of Gallic and Gallo-Roman bronzes, and objects relating to the city's past and navigation on the Loire. The museum also holds temporary exhibitions on Joan of Arc and the History of Orléans.

FRAC CENTRE VAL DE LOIRE REGION

6 CERCIL-MUSÉE

A memorial to Jewish children, victims of the Vel d'Hiv roundup in Paris. It offers an exhibit area with educational activities, cultural events and an archive centre for further research.

6 HÔTEL GROSLOT

This typical Neo-Renaissance mansion opens the doors of its Salon d'Honneur and Wedding Room.

Immerse yourself in a sumptuous setting which once hosted royal guests such as Charles IX and Henri IV!

JOAN OF ARC'S HOUSE

A half-timbered house, rebuilt on the site where Joan of Arc was lodged from April 29 to May 9, 1429 during the siege of Orléans.

A digital presentation tells about the life of Joan of Arc before you continue in her footsteps to the Hôtel Cabu and the Musée des Beaux-Arts. The research centre houses some 37,000 documents consecrated to her life and times!

CHARLES PEGUY CENTRE

From Tuesday to Saturday, come turn the pages of the life and works of the great Orléans writer and pamphleteer Charles Péguy in a new, fully renovated museum.

SAINT-PIERRE-LE-PUELLIER CLOISTER

One of the oldest churches in Orléans! This heritage site, dating back to the 12th century, now hosts a dozen temporary exhibitions each year.
